Fourth Sunday of Lent

During Advent, we celebrate Gaudete Sunday on the Third Sunday of Advent. In Lent, we celebrate Laetare Sunday on the Fourth Sunday of Lent. Both days refer to happiness. In fact, both 'Gaudete' and 'Laetare' mean rejoice, and the connection is obvious as they are both days of joyful anticipation in the middle of liturgical seasons that might be seen as deeply solemn.



This Sunday, on Laetare Sunday, Easter is exactly 21 days away. It is a day in which the Church expresses hope and joy in the midst of our Lenten fasts and penances. Our hope and joy are in the Lord as through his Passion, Death and Resurrection, Christ has reconciled us with God and with one another. Let us rejoice!



FEAST OF ST. PATRICK - SUNDAY, MARCH 17TH, 9:30 AM MASS



On Sunday, March 17th, all are welcome to come to St. Patrick's Church (2263 Brunswick St.) and celebrate the Feast of St. Patrick at their 9:30 am Mass.

St. Patrick of Ireland is one of the world's most popular saints. He was born in Roman Britain and when he was fourteen or so, he was captured by Irish pirates during a raiding party and taken to Ireland as a slave to herd and tend sheep. Patrick's captivity lasted until he was twenty, when he escaped after having a dream from God in which

he was told to leave Ireland by going to the coast. There, he found some sailors who took him back to Britain where he was reunited with his family.

A vision prompted Patrick to study for the priesthood. Later, he was ordained a Bishop and was sent to take the Gospel to Ireland. He is credited with converting the Irish to Christianity. By the time of his death on March 17, 461, he had established monasteries, churches, and schools throughout Ireland; he had performed many miracles and wrote of his love for God.

SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH - TUESDAY, MARCH 19TH - 7:00 PM MASS



The highest feast in honour of St. Joseph is celebrated annually on March 19. The Feast day becoming the official practice of the Church in the 1500s.

Of St. Joseph, Pope Francis has stated that: "Each of us can discover in Joseph -- the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence - an intercessor, a

support and a guide in times of trouble". "St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation."

Joseph is the Patron Saint of the Universal Church, families, fathers, expectant mothers, travelers, immigrants, house sellers and buyers, craftsmen, engineers and working people, among others. He was chosen as the Patron Saint of Canada by the first Recollect Franciscan missionaries in 1624.

The Parish Mass celebrating the Solemnity of St. Joseph will take place in St. Stephen's Church at a special 7:00 pm Mass on Tuesday, March 19th. Following the mass, the Knights of Columbus Council 8666 will be hosting a reception in the Church Hall. (The 12:00 noon Mass at St. Catherine's Church is cancelled.)
