PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD On Palm Sunday, we usher in Holy Week with palm



On <u>Palm Sunday</u>, we usher in Holy Week with palm branches in hand, remembering the triumphant entry of our Lord into Jerusalem, and the beginning of the week that leads us to the commemoration of the Passion, Death and Resurrection of our Lord – the Paschal Triduum.

On that first Palm Sunday, "A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from

the trees and spread them on the road." In ancient times, palm branches symbolized goodness and victory. It was common practice in the ancient world to welcome home a king or war hero by laying out a path of branches for him to ride or walk over. With this same purpose, palm was used by the people of Jerusalem to honor Jesus, their King, as he arrived in victory and triumph, but most did not understand what kind of king Jesus would be.

In Jesus' time, military rulers usually road into the cities on horses. Jesus came on a donkey. The donkey was a symbol of peace, and those who rode upon them proclaimed peaceful intentions. This was a sign that he was a leader who would triumph with love and compassion, and not with military might. His was a kingdom that would grow in the hearts of people who put their faith and trust in God.

Even as the coatless multitudes waved the palm branches and shouted for joy, they missed the true reason for Jesus' presence. They could neither see nor understand the cross.

CHRISM MASS: TUESDAY, MARCH 26TH

This year's Chrism Mass will take place on Tuesday, March 26th, at Saint Mary's Cathedral Basilica at 12:00 noon. The Chrism Mass is celebrated by Catholics around the world during Holy Week. This

celebration highlights the connection of the local bishop with the people of God through his presbyters (priests). At this special Mass two key events take place: all priests renew their promises to serve the people of God and the bishop blesses the holy oils (the Oil of the sick, the Oil of Catechumen, and the Oil of Chrism) to be used in the various sacraments for the coming year. Gathering with the priests, blessing these oils, and sending out these oils from this Mass to the various faith communities across our Diocese emphasizes the unity of all the faithful (ordained and lay) in our Diocese under the leadership of our Archbishop.

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA AND CHAPLET

St. Francis and St. Clare of Assisi Parish is celebrating Divine Mercy Sunday on Sunday, April 7th, from 2:30-4:00 pm at St. Catherine's Church. This time of adoration will include the



Litany of Trust and the Divine Mercy Chaplet. All parishioners are invited to attend.

Between 1930 and 1938 Christ appeared to Sister Faustina, a Sister of Mercy in Poland, who initiated the Divine Mercy devotion. On Good Friday, 1937, Jesus requested that Blessed Faustina make a special Novena before the Feast of Mercy, from Good Friday through the following Saturday. He gave her a chaplet to be recited and said that it was appropriate to pray the chaplet at three o'clock each afternoon (the Hour of Great Mercy). She was canonized on April 30, 2000, the Sunday after Easter, the Feast of Divine Mercy. For information on how to recite the Chaplet, visit: Divine Mercy Chaplet


